October President's Letter



Greetings MOS Friends,

I hope you've enjoyed your summer. We had wonderful warm weather. Judging by the photos submitted for Show's and Tell over the past several months, many of you enjoyed fruitful growing.

Had I not been distracted by my vacation plans, I would have pruned the flower spike from my *Psychopsis*, thinking it had finally died (I've lost track of number of flowers it has produced). There are two flowers developing on the spike and it also looks as if it's greened up recently. I also

have 2 *Dendrobiums* still flowering since late August, a possible flower on one of my *Bulbophyllums*. The *Cymbidium* flowers are now fading.

My Myrmecodia platyrea ("ant head") is putting out new growths off the main bulb so it looks like it's creating new plants (the description says it can only be propagated by seed). I have about 15 seedlings started. When I bought the plant at POE 2022, the seller told me it was easy to grow from seed, and that certainly seems to be true. The plant puts out an average of 4 or 5 flowers a week. They look like one-inch-long white tubes, last only a couple of days, and each contains a single seed.

I mentioned a vacation. I spent a week in South Dakota; partially to do a bit of research and the rest to sightsee. The last time I was there (probably July

25, 1958) I was 4 ½ years old and spent 5 days of that trip confined to a hotel room in Custer, SD with the measles. That hotel still exists. And, I did obtain quite a bit of history that helped me reconstruct a portion of that trip. If you want to hear more of that fascinating story, you simply must attend the November meeting. I have finally seen Mt. Rushmore and Devil's Tower and I wandered about and explored the Black Hills. Plus, I did see quite a bit of wildlife; some of it quite up close and personal. I'll have a pile of photos and a few stories at the November meeting.

Please remember that the November 22 meeting is our annual member's Show and Tell where members are welcome to share their own photo moments. If you would like to do a presentation, and these do not need to be orchid related, then please let us know by sending an email to marin.orchids@gmail.com. Our November meeting will be virtual, on Zoom only. You'll see connection details elsewhere in the Back Bulb.

September Speaker Review Marni Turkel "Give It a Rest"

Marni shared her extensive exploration of dry rest needs of orchids. She began by emphasizing the importance of understanding weather patterns seasonal shifts, wind, precipitation in different continents.

Some clues that a plant may need a dry rest, after eliminating water quality, temperature, light, fertilizer & bush snails are: failure to thrive, failure to flower, rotting on new growth, over production of keikis, roots rot over winter are some signs they need dry rest

How to learn what plants need a dry rest? Read habitat description, check Charles Baker "Introduction to Orchid Species Culture Climate" tables. How to learn what plants need: Ask other growers, look up where the plant comes from, study weather patterns for the area, pay attention to description of habitat, trials and error.

Consideration of timing - by the calendar, by growth pattern, when leaves wither, when pseudobulb matures, just as new growth begins, as the roots emerge, after the roots emerge....it depends

Considerations of water - dryness of roots, water occasionally, mist only to prevent shriveling, humidity only, rate of change into and out of dry rest, if the temperature is less than ideal, flower damage and duration of bloom Consideration of light, summer cloud cover, winter sun, deciduous forest, Considerations of temperature - differential between seasons, duration of low temperatures, day/night differential.

Considerations of fertilizer, decrease nitrogen before dry rest, discontinue fertilizer before dry rest, change to low nitrogen fertilizer

Marni showed a Gallery of Dry Rest Plants. Species such as angraecum didieri, baptistonia sarcodes, various barkereria species, bulbophyllum kanburiensi, calante kawakamii, cattleya walkeriana, cuitlauzina pendula, cymbidium devonianum, dendrobium langicornu Ernie, encyclia microbulbon, habenaria medusa, neofinetia falcata 'Gojofukiran', oncidium crispum prieta, phalaenopsis lobbii and more.

AOS has a wealth of information for growers on their website titled <u>Orchid</u> <u>Care:</u> Here is a sample:

Things to do in the Fall:

Like spring, Fall is an important transitional season and orchid growers should be making preparations for the coming winter. As days get shorter and cooler, orchid growth will slow and in some cases, cease altogether. Unless a plant is in a crisis situation, put off any repotting until the lengthening days of spring. For many orchids, it is this change of seasonal conditions that begins flower initiation. As we move into November, be on the lookout for developing inflorescences on *Phalaenopsis*, *Cymbidium* and certain hybrids and species in other genera, and begin staking when spikes reach 6-8 inches.

If you have been summering some or all of your orchids outside, now is a good time to get your indoor growing area cleaned up and ready to welcome the returning orchids. Whether it is windowsill carts, a basement light setup or greenhouse, use diluted chlorine bleach (1:10) or Physan to clean off any accumulated algae. It is easier to make repairs when there are no plants, so make sure that your growing area is in top condition for the trying conditions of winter. Make sure that heaters are working and that you have plenty of fuel. If you use backup devices or alarms, test them too. Be sure to check plants thoroughly for pests before returning them to the close quarters of your indoor growing area or greenhouse.
