November President's Letter



Greetings MOS Friends,

By the time you're reading this, Daylight Savings will have ended and we will be well into "winter time." While the days here have been fairly warm, the nights are becoming cold enough to put the heater on. I'm also taking Kitsu out earlier for her walks because it's a pain to walk her when it's dark and there are coyotes roaming about.

The colder weather has not deterred my outdoor plants. One *cymbidium* is preparing to bloom with one inflorescence already with buds and another

just starting out. There's also a *dendrobium* out there growing like a weed while sitting under my birch tree and surrounded by taller-than-it-should-be grass. And, the massive staghorn that was left by the former owner is growing quite well. I'm very happy about that because it seemed to suffer from the weather last year but this year's heat has had no effect on it. Indoors there are no new plants in bloom; just the same 4-5 that have been in bloom since mid-September.

I should be getting my patio back soon. Since March, the patio has had 4 large pallets of kitchen cabinets and parts while waiting for other parts from Ikea. The last piece came in early October so the kitchen install can begin. Once the patio is clear I can then set up my growing area, install irrigation, and finally my patio table and grilling area. I'm really looking forward to having that planned

space become usable again.

I worry if all those *cymbidiums* that have been sitting under the trees by my lawn, will really want to be back on the patio.

We received a generous donation of plants from the Orion Sylvester estate. Some of you may remember Orion, an MOS member about 8 years ago. Orion passed recently. We received approximately 50 plants from his collection. There are a number of "*Dendrobiums,* xLC's Tilandsias *Laelias, Encylia's*" and more.You'll likely hear more about these within the next month or so.

Our October auction was very successful. Thank you to everyone who participated. Alan brought a great selection of plants. And, we had generous donations from Huntington Botanical Gardens, Fred Clarke of Sunset Valley Orchids, Bernie Kepke (a private donor), and Julie Morelli, for a total of 101 plants (if my sums are correct). Alan kept the sale moving at a brisk pace. And, much to my surprise, the auction was completed in just 2 hours.

Our next meeting is our annual member's Show and Tell where members are welcome to share their own photo moments. AOS Corner, November, 2022



Why are my orchid's leaves wrinkled and leathery?

AOS has a wealth of information for growers on their website, titled Orchid Care. Here is a sample: This orchid has lost its roots, probably due to

overwatering, and cannot take up water. Shriveled leaves indicate a lack of water to plant tissue. The next step is to determine why the plant is not getting sufficient water. First, look at the roots. If they appear a healthy white or green and are plump, and the medium is in good shape, suspect under watering, especially if the roots are white and the pot is very light. If, on the other hand, the roots are in poor condition, suspect root loss. If the plant has no roots, it cannot take up any water, no matter how much you give it. In this case, the cause may be root loss owing to <u>over</u>watering or medium deterioration, or a recently repotted and poorly established plant. The immediate solution is to raise humidity in the plants' vicinity to reduce stress on whatever roots there may be, and then deal with whether to repot or to simply wait until the plant establishes in the fresh medium.
