February President's Letter



Happy February, MOS Friends,

As I write this, it's bucketing down rain outside, I took advantage of the lighter rain earlier to take a couple of flats from the greenhouse to let those plants get rain water. This storm is not cold. It's been shirtsleeve weather here for the past couple of days. The plants enjoyed the watering and I saved some on the water bill for the month.

I gave a basic orchids presentation to some of the residents of my community. We had 14 people attend. I updated my Orchids 101 talk that I've done at the Marin County Fair to include a

PowerPoint presentation. That let me show more photos and give audience more information.

I usually do a repotting demonstration but this time I made it a live event. I had some donated *phalaenopsis* so I brought enough for everyone and let them do their own repotting. They were VERY enthusiastic. As soon as they got to the repotting tables they were pulling plants out of pots, sphagnum moss flying everywhere. I had supplied my cutter so that people could trim and again there were blades flashing everywhere. I'm surprised that everyone left with the number of appendages as they had when they arrived.

The reception for the talk was so good I've sent out notes to the other 4 communities in the area for a similar presentation. It might mean some new members for Sonoma, Napa, or us.

By the way, I receive donation plants about every other month. If anyone wants some *phalaenopsis* let me know. The last time I had plants no one wanted them. Sometimes there are some other types mixed in such as two *Miltonia* but they really were not in very good shape. The ones I received recently were all white (perhaps *Phalaenopsis amabilis*) except for one. That one may be peloric or at least not really the more standard form; the lip does not have the standard fangs one usually sees,

POE is coming in mid-February. In fact, by the time you read this it will only be maybe a week away. Please do go see our exhibit there. A lot of work will have gone into creating it. Thank you in advance to everyone who helped, donated plants and arranged things.

A reminder that the Santa Barbara orchid show is coming in March. If you have not attended this show, it is well worth the trip. The displays are large and complex and filled with marvelous plants. Plus, there are a number of nurseries in the area that also have sales.

Our February meeting will be at Kol Shofar. The venue for our subsequent meetings is still unknown, although we're still looking. We are delighted to have as our first speaker of the year, Fred Clarke of Sunset Valley Orchids. 

This talk presents a new perspective on growing orchids. Have you ever thought of your orchids as a living art collection and yourself as the curator? Philosophers have described seven universal features of art, and this talk will consider how those principles apply to orchids and help you become a better curator of your own orchid/art collection.

Learn about the four key areas to develop your mastery as an orchid grower: water, light, temperature and repotting. We will cover why orchids grow as they do and explore both fundamentals and advanced growing techniques that will elevate you above the 80th percentile of all orchid growers. This is a talk not to be missed.

About the Speaker:

Fred Clarke has been growing orchids for over 40 years and hybridizing for 38 of those years. With over 36 years as a professional grower and manager in the horticultural industry, Fred applies these skills at his orchid nursery, Sunset Valley Orchids, located just north of San Diego, California.

He is a passionate orchid grower whose curiosity in orchids is broad and varied. Although developing *Cattleya* hybrids has been his sustaining interest, he is also actively creating new *Australian Dendrobium* and *Paphiopedilum* hybrids plus some others to be named if they work out!

His pioneering work in *Catasetum* intergeneric hybrids led to the development of several notable hybrids, including the groundbreaking grex, *Fredclarkeara After Dark*, which produced "the **blackest** flower ever witnessed." This grex has received over 100 flower quality awards worldwide including eight highly coveted First Class Certificates from the American Orchid Society (FCC/AOS).

Fred is an accredited American Orchid Society judge in the Pacific South Judging Region. His hybrids have received hundreds of quality awards for orchid enthusiasts from the American Orchid Society and other orchid societies worldwide.



Jan Anderson - Grower Extraordinare!



Jan in her greenhouse equipped with fans, misters, overhead devices and more. A "Sensor Push Program" allows her to check and adjust temperature & humidity from anywhere. She and Fred (who specializes in phragmipediums) have lived in Marin for about 2.5 years



35 years of growing orchids beginning with *cattleyas* (Rlc.Malworth above). Some orchids in her collection go back to the 80's.

They lived for many years in both Orange County and Oregon. Many of the orchids in their Novato greenhouse were shipped from Orange County and Oregon greenhouses.



Six 275 gallon water tanks to collect rain water. Jan puts the water into a 40 gallon container into which she mixes fertilizers (different varieties). She handwaters her collection generally once a week - more often in the summer.
