March President's Letter



Greetings fellow Orchidholics

Time is really flying. We're into March already.

My green house is doing well despite the cover already deteriorating after only 18 months - about 2 square feet of the cover have lost the plastic between the reinforcing webbing.

Despite that I have a couple of *dendrobiums* blooming and a number of spiking *oncidiums*. . Other plants are coming to life. The *vandas* and *rhipsalis* are also doing REALLY well. The biggest one looks like a huge fuzzy ball covered with

white flowers. The staghorn in the corner has now taken over the corner and it's too heavy to hang on my greenhouse frame.

We did very well at POE. The exhibit was lovely with 58 plants from 7 contributors. Besides the plant awards, which are elsewhere in this publication, we won the AOS award for best display, the Orchid Digest award, and best display by visiting society, 2nd place. Thank you to everyone who contributed plants (Lynne, Susan, Paul, Maria, Cathy, Tom) and time to set up and take down the exhibit (Maria, Brian, Debra, Kristen, Lynne, Susan, Rosemary). We have photos elsewhere in this publication and Julie will construct a video for later.

Now I'm going to get serious.

You already know that Naoko is retiring as our Treasurer. We seek a volunteer to take over the position. We have had no response. Here's the hard part. Marin Orchid Society is a 501(c)3 organization. We enjoy a special tax status and we can solicit for donations for fundraising (and provide a tax benefit for those who contribute).

Along with that status we are subject to certain regulations. One of those is that we must have a Board of Directors. That Board has three critical components: President, Secretary, and Treasurer. The other members of the Board are important to the operation of the Society but the three I mentioned are absolutely necessary and legally, we cannot operate without those three positions being filled.

Unless we have a person willing to become the new Treasurer, we run the very real possibility that Marin Orchid Society cannot legally continue to operate next year.

The position is not demanding but does require attention to detail. Some basic accounting skills are necessary. Naoko will provide what's necessary to fulfill the needs of the position. If you're interested, please contact us through the MOS email.

March Speaker: Lynne Murrell How to take Amazing Orchid Photographs



I have been involved with plants and gardening my whole life, but my love of Orchids began with a single Phal, probably a gift from someone, around 1990. One thing led to another...we all know how that goes. I moved my struggling garage-collection into a small greenhouse at California Orchids in Bolinas about 10 years ago, and was delighted when everything began to thrive. So I up-sized to a spacious, heated greenhouse, and expanded my collection to include Orchids from nearly every continent,

Since most of my family and many friends are scattered around the country, and they were all curious about this Orchid thing in my life, I began taking photos of my favorites and making them into Orchid gift Cards about 20 years ago. As this was before digital photography, the photos were variable in quality, but my family oohed-and-aahed nevertheless. Fast forward to today, when digital cameras have revolutionized photography for us all, and the quality of photos from our I-Phones is nothing short of astounding.

I continue to use my husband's Nikon D750 camera, with a macro lens and studio lights, to capture high-quality images of my Orchids. They can then be improved using LightRoom and PhotoShop tools on our computer. I will demonstrate my whole photography set-up, and take photos during the meeting, and I invite everyone to bring an Orchid which you would like to have photographed. You can take a photo with your phone, and I'll photograph it with my camera on a tripod, and we'll compare. When I return home, I will upload my photos of your Beauties, and print them for you, and I'll bring them to the April meeting.

You will be watching the demonstration on the big screen during the meeting. Using a tethering cable to hook the camera to my laptop, and then (hopefully) connecting to ZOOM and Share Screen, you will be able to see a full screen-sized image as we go along. We will talk about lighting, shutter

speed, focusing...and I will try to answer your questions.

I look forward to seeing you and photographing your Orchids on March 25 at Kol Shofar.

Tom Pickford's Cymbidium erythraeum won Best Species in the Show. Another beautiful rosette and a trophy.

Lynne's Aliceara Wine Spots 'Big Fella' won best Oncidium by an Advanced grower.

Lynne' Phalaenopsis Lianher Coral won best Phalaenopsis by an Advanced Grower.

Lynne's Dendrobium Mini Snowflake won best Dendrobium by an Advanced Grower.

Probably 2/3 of the plants on our display had a ribbon: Blue, Red or White, for the various categories in which they were qualified and entered.

Thank you and Congratulations to all, for another beautiful team effort!


