April President's Letter



Greetings fellow Orchidholics

If April brings showers, what does May bring? Pilgrims (April showers bring Mayflowers).

I hope you're all enjoying this changeable weather. My greenhouse is working its way to full blossom (hope some of the plants will be in good shape for the Marin County Fair). Several *Dendrobiums* are currently in bloom with assorted *Oncidiums*, *Zygopetalum*, and even a *Vanda* (first I've ever bloomed) all putting up spikes. A total of 11 plants are in some stage of flowering. The greenhouse has quite a pleasant aroma.

I am missing my greenhouse frog. Last time I heard him was several weeks ago and since that day, nothing. He kept the bug population down. Maybe he did too good of a job and had to leave for a more bountiful hunting ground.

The cover is deteriorating and out of warranty although the manufacturer will give me a good deal on a replacement greenhouse. My greenhouse is 8x10 - a size that is out of fashion now so the new in-fashion size of 10x10 will require that I take up 20 more square feet of my yard. A bit more space inside would be welcome.

We have several very good speakers and topics lined up for the remainder of the year. Mt. Baker is supplying several via Zoom. We will also have an inperson meeting on those nights and opportunity table as well. If you cannot come in person to the meeting, I encourage you to take advantage of watching the presentations from the comfort of your homes.

The Marin County Fair is coming up July 2-6. It's only 3 months away. The Fair theme this year is "bugs". If anyone has some model bugs, flies, bees, beetles, please let me know. We could use some themed decorative objects. Please consider monitoring your plants so that they are healthy and spikes are suitably staked for display. More information will follow.

We are also planning our annual BBQ get-together. That's even farther away but this year we are planning to merge this with our annual auction. The idea is that we may be able to encourage more people (read: bidders) to attend if the event is held in a pleasant outdoor setting, on a warm summer afternoon ... possibly with copious amounts of wine and margaritas. April Speaker: Eron Borne Growing Phragmepediums - (The Speaker will be on Zoom)



Phragmipedium Program:

This program focuses on growing *Phragmipediums* by Eron Borne of the Central Louisiana Orchid Society. One of Eron's specialties and the genera he is most passionate about are the *Phragmipediums*, which he has been growing in Louisiana for the past 15 years and has even done his own hybridizing with them. He currently has about 150+ *Phragmipediums* in his collection, successfully growing most of the species here in the deep south. This presentation walks you through an overview of the prominent species in our hybrids, modern hybrids popular today, and how he grows them under the most challenging of conditions, touching on all aspects of culture. Before growing his *Phragmipediums* in a greenhouse, he grew them under lights and on a windowsill. He has received numerous AOS awards on his *Phragmipediums* to date. Eron has also won show trophies for Best Grown Plant and Best Flower in the Cypripedium Alliance with his *Phragmipediums*.

Eron is the immediate past President and current board member for the CLOS, plus serves on the AOS and SWROGA Education Committees. He is also currently an AOS Trustee and AOS Accredited judge with the Louisiana Judging Center in Alexandria. Eron has traveled and seen orchids in-situ in Colombia, Ecuador, the Caribbean, Costa Rica, El Salvador, and Panama, as well as imported plants from Ecuador, Colombia, Peru, Africa, Canada, Germany, and Asia. In addition to *Phragmipediums*, he has a large number of *Cattleyas* and *Vandas*, and is growing over 60 different genera in the same greenhouse, including *Masdevallia*, *Dracula*, *Miltoniopsis*, *Restrepia*, *Zygopetalum*, *C. coccinea* and many other intermediate to cooler growing orchids. Eron has also received numerous AOS awards on many different

genera. He currently lives in Harrisonburg along with his wife Anna, and his twin daughters Elizabeth and Julia.

If you are a member of the American Orchid Society (if you are NOT you should be, to support our national Orchid community), you will have seen in the April issue the 2023 National awards, when Paul and Phyllis won the Milton Carpenter Award for the best intergeneric Oncidinae of the year. Paul and Phyllis will be honored at the AOS Spring Members' Meeting in Annapolis this month.

The Milton Carpenter Intergeneric Oncidiinae Award is presented to the grower of the orchid plant regarded as the most outstanding example of intergeneric hybridizing within the Oncidiinae: Otostele Summit 'Phyllis' AM/AOS, March 1, 2023, California-Sierra Nevada Center Monthly Judging, exhibited by Paul and Phyllis Chim and photographed by Lynne Murrell. Paul relates that this plant was given to him by Bob Hamilton. "Bob grows his orchids in Pacifica, California where cool grown orchids are doing well.... This plant was in my greenhouse in San Leandro, California, 25 miles (40 km) from Pacifica. I treated the plant the same as cymbidiums." He waters thoroughly and fertilizes weakly (30-10-10), weekly. Catchy phrase!


