June President's Letter



Kol Shofar is not available for our July meeting. The venue for our July meeting is The Sunrise Center in Corte Madera.

Hello fellow orchid enthusiasts. I hope you're enjoying our lead-in to summer.

My greenhouse is doing well. A lot of the blooming is over so now there's a lot of new growth starting up.The grandkids are also doing well. I'm heading back down to SoCal for my granddaughter's 4th birthday.

Let's reflect on our recent meeting attendance. In

May, we had a modest turnout: seven people attended in person and three joined online. Interestingly, we had more guests from Mt. Baker than our own members. Even though we had an excellent speaker, two attendees left after the presentation. As a result, only five people participated in the opportunity table for plants. I understand that a couple of our members were on vacation, but this doesn't explain the broader trend of declining attendance. It's clear that the disruptions of 2020 impacted our social habits. It's encouraging to see the world slowly returning to normalcy.

We did see a great turnout at The Sunrise Center where we filled the room. This raises the question: Is the location at Kol Shofar less appealing? If so, remember that you can always join via Zoom to enjoy the presentations. However, our online participation is also lower than we'd like. Regarding meeting spaces, we've been fortunate at Kol Shofar, where we don't incur costs for the venue, technology, or the dedicated support from Kirk. Other venues could cost us at least \$150 per meeting, often with less reliable technology. Investing in a different space is feasible if it means better attendance.

If the issue lies with the presenters, **please share your thoughts.** Let us know the topics and speakers you're interested in, and we'll do our best to accommodate your preferences. We value your input, especially since we invest significantly in bringing quality presenters, and we want everyone to benefit from their insights.

If there are other factors affecting your participation, we're eager to hear them. This is your Society, and your feedback is crucial to making it better. We understand we can't satisfy everyone, but knowing your concerns helps us address them effectively.

Thank you for being a part of our community. Let's work together to make our gatherings more enjoyable and engaging for all.

I met with the Marin County Fair people to discuss this year's display. There is a lot of redesign of the exhibit floor that will open up the demonstration area and the space. Our display will be about 50% larger than last year - we will have our own demonstration area. I am hoping we can do hands-on repotting between the two presentation windows. It depends on how much plant source material I can obtain. The presentation area has been enlarged to a seating capacity of at least 60 and a large screen monitor has been added to aid in the presentations. We have presentations at 1 and 3 p.m. daily from the 3rd through the 7th.

I need somebody, or somebodies, to take over two talks on 4th July. I have another obligation for that day. Please let me know if you want to take this day. You'll get free entry to the Fair and also free parking.

June 25 Speaker: Dave Sorokowsky Don't Fear the Slippers (Paphiopedilum)



We are delighted to welcome back, Dave Sorokowsky of Paph Paradise. Do attend the in-person meeting to be eligible to win Opportunity Table plants he will be providing!

About Dave:

After receiving his degree in biochemistry from the University of Toronto, Dave opted to step outside his chosen field and operated a tropical fish import business for eight years. Upon returning to school, Dave received a degree in enology and viticulture from Brock University in St. Catharines, Ontario. While attending Brock, Dave began acquiring orchids one 2" pot at a time and before he graduated, Dave had over 100 orchids. Winemaking and a passion for orchids prompted Dave to seek a warmer climate in California about one year later. Dave has been growing *paphiopedilums* for about 20 years and seriously hybridizing for over 10 years. He is an accredited AOS judge and his *paphiopedilums* have received over 100 awards to date from the AOS and CSA. Many of those awarded plants playing important roles in his breeding program. In 2018 Dave left winemaking in order to focus all of his time running Paph Paradise Orchids.

May Speaker, Carol Klonowski Vandaceous Orchids



"You snooze you lose". Rumor has it that some members walked away with a plethora of *vandaceous* orchids from the May opportunity table. Carol gave an outstanding presentation on the latest developments in *vandaceous* orchid breeding covering their history. I was out of town so viewed the recording recently. I learned so much. I knew the Big Island of Hawai'i is called "the orchid island". I learned the reason was because from 1925 they took over the commercial cut flower production of *vanda's* and breeding. Thailand became the prime breeders from the 1960's to present.

Unique characteristics of vanda's include

- 3 lobed lip with spur
- spidery or twisted flower segment
- free hanging roots
- monopodial growth habits
- require high humidity and frequent watering

Most fascinating was learning about the new *vanda* paradigm as more cold tolerant varieties are coming to market. MOS members can view this most educational presentation upon request.


